#### **Objectives of the FDP:**

- To provide faculty with an understanding of curriculum alignment and the principles guiding University syllabus design.
- To introduce Outcome-Based Education (OBE) as a framework for effective teaching and learning.
- To offer hands-on experience in creating CO-PO mapping sheets using Excel, fostering faculty competence in documenting and aligning course outcomes with program objectives.

DIMR, in collaboration with Dr. D.Y. Patil Institute of Management and Entrepreneur Development, hosted a five day workshop on CO-PO Mapping from Jan 25<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024, featuring Prof. (Dr.) Ashutosh Misal, Director of Indira Institute of Management, Pune, as the keynote speaker.

The session was inaugurated by the Director of DIMR, Dr. Sajid Alvi. He introduced the guest and emphasized the importance of curriculum alignment and the principles guiding the University syllabus design. Thereafter Dr. Ashutosh Misal provided invaluable insights into aligning curriculum design with the principles of Outcome-Based Education (OBE), aiming to enhance teaching effectiveness and academic structure in higher education.

Dr. Misal introduced attendees to curriculum alignment concepts, elaborating on the essential principles that guide the development of University syllabi. He emphasized the importance of OBE in the modern academic landscape, outlining how it improves teaching and learning by setting clear objectives and measurable outcomes. The sessions thoroughly explored the OBE process, stressing the importance of defining graduate attributes that prepare students for real-world challenges and employability.

The central focus was on the practical aspects of CO-PO Mapping, including detailed discussions on Course Outcomes (CO), Program Outcomes (PO), Course Program Outcomes (CPO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Program Educational Objectives (PEO). Dr. Misal shared practical methods for mapping these components to align course objectives with program goals effectively.

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The second day onwards all faculty members were involved in hands on experience and worked on overview of creating comprehensive course files, which include structured documentation of objectives, outcomes, and mapping practices. The FDP included hands-on training, where faculty members worked in Excel to develop CO-PO mapping sheets. This practical session allowed faculty to apply their learning directly and gain experience in mapping processes critical for effective curriculum design. The interactive and application-based approach fostered a deeper understanding of aligning educational outcomes with course content, thus promoting quality and transparency in teaching.

The FDP also delved into the concept of continuous assessment sheets as a tool for evaluating student performance in relation to COs, POs, and PSOs throughout the duration of a course or program. Continuous assessment allows educators to monitor student progress, identify areas for improvement, and make timely interventions to support student learning. These assessment sheets typically include a variety of assessment methods such as quizzes, assignments, projects, presentations, and examinations.



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#### **Key Components Discussed:**

- Designing assessment criteria aligned with COs, POs, and PSOs.
- Incorporating formative and summative assessment strategies.
- Providing timely and constructive feedback to students.
- Using assessment data to inform instructional practices and curriculum revisions.

Furthermore, the FDP shed light on the significance of academic review and planning in the context of CO-PO-PSO mapping. Regular review and planning processes are essential for ensuring that educational programs remain relevant, effective, and responsive to changing needs and expectations. Academic review involves evaluating the attainment of COs, POs, and PSOs, identifying areas of strength and weakness, and implementing appropriate measures for improvement.

- Engaging faculty, students, alumni, and industry stakeholders in the review process.
- Utilizing feedback and data from assessment activities for program enhancement.

• Faculty members acquired practical skills in prompt engineering, learning how to communicate effectively with AI tools for maximum utility.



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

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

Inaugural session:

In his speech he shared his views with participants that researchers should focus on societal needs, commercial value and viability of research work. After the inaugural session, Dr Hemant Katole, the resource person started his discussion with explanation of the basic concepts of research methodology. He has elucidated the on the aspects like selection of topic by faculty members, and types of research. He has also shared a few important aspects to be considered during research. In the afternoon session, he enlightened the faculty members on different concepts like induction and deduction, hypothesis, variables and overall research design.

The session was devoted to the importance of literature review and gap identification. Dr Hemant Katole explained various aspects of literature review like how to start literature review, which articles to consider, how to cover it in the thesis, different styles of citations etc. In the afternoon session, he covered the topics like variables, data types and data collection methods. During the process he has given many practical examples to the participants

The third day started with the inputs on designing the questionnaire and formulation of hypotheses and objectives. He also coved basics of scale development and steps in designing better measures. The afternoon session dealt with details of sampling techniques and hypothesis testing.

In the morning session, the issues on reliability and validity of data were explained by Dr Hemant Katole. In the afternoon session, participants were given inputs on evaluation of journal articles and selection of journals.


19th Nov 2021



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

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#### **Event description:**
